

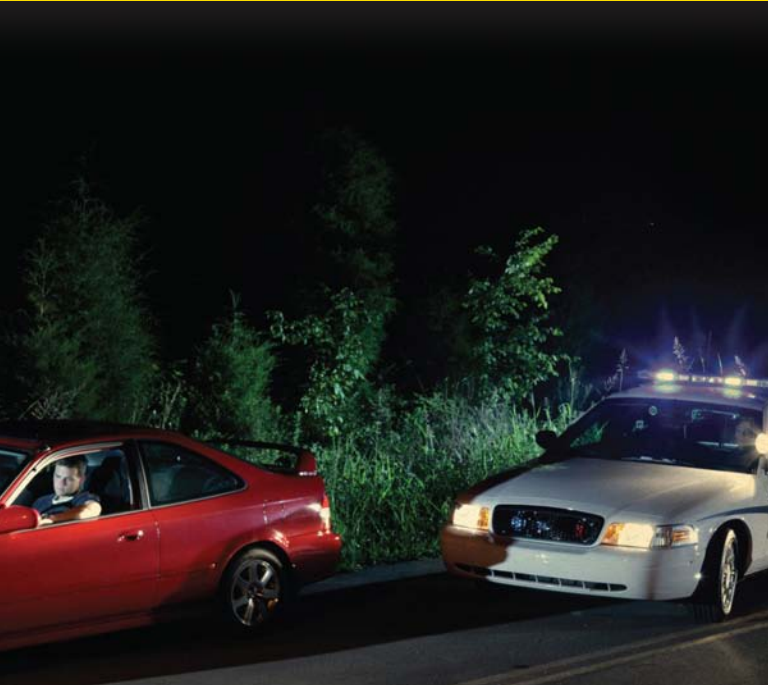

TENNESSEE'S ALCOHOL LAWS

TCA 55-10-401 AND TCA 55-10-403*

- A first-time DUI offender's license will be revoked for a year.
- A first-time DUI offender will spend at least 48 hours in jail and may have to serve much longer.
- A first-time DUI offender will pay bail fines, court costs, attorney fees and other fees amounting up to \$5,000.
- A first-time DUI offender will attend a DUI School or a Victim Impact Panel. A Judge may also require Drug & Alcohol Treatment and the person to operate only a motor vehicle that is equipped with a functioning ignition interlock device.
- Repeat offenders may have a condition of bond that includes the use of an ignition interlock devices, transdermal monitoring devices, house arrest and/or drug tests, and/or greater penalties.

TENNESSEE'S PRIMARY SEAT BELT LAWS

TCA 55-9-602, TCA 55-9-603 and TCA 55-9-606*

Law Enforcement Can Stop a Vehicle and Ticket IF:

- Front-seat driver and occupants are not properly restrained.
- Children 9 years old and younger are not restrained in an age appropriate child passenger restraint system.**
- Youth 9 -15 years old are not wearing a safety belt occupying any seat in a passenger motor vehicle.
- 16 & 17 year-old drivers/passengers are not wearing a safety belt occupying any seat in a passenger motor vehicle.

** All child restraint/safety belt systems must meet Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards.
