These types of violent crimes are “Crashes” not accidents. Impaired driving crashes in TN 2015 = 8,278. Injured Persons = 5,764. Killed 375. Campaign to eliminate drunk driving and MADD TN anti-drunk driving efforts include Underage Drinking Solutions and Victim Services 877-MADD-HELP <a href="#">MADD - Victim Services</a> Driverless cars &amp; aftermarket cars effect – Alcohol makers versus automakers and the financial impact.</p> <p>b.
